PRINCIPAL FINANCIAL GROUP, INC. ANNOUNCES OUTLOOK FOR 2009

Des Moines, IA (December 10, 2008) – Principal Financial Group, Inc. (NYSE:PFG) today announced that the company expects 2009 operating earnings per diluted share (EPS) to range from \$2.75 to \$3.25. 1.2 Guidance for 2009 incorporates certain assumptions, including: a 3 percent decline in average assets under management in 2009 compared to 2008 based on an average S&P 500 Index of 900 in 2009; operating losses for the Corporate and Other segment of \$90 to \$110 million; and no share repurchase activity. Company guidance does not contemplate any acquisition or divestiture activity other than where a definitive agreement has been signed by the company and publicly announced.

Equity market weakness has muted the company's outlook for 2009 EPS. However, the company remains committed to its long-term goals: average annual improvement in return on equity (ROE)³ of roughly 50 basis points; and 11 to 13 percent average annual growth in EPS, reflecting the company's outlook for continued strength in the U.S. and international asset management and accumulation businesses.⁴





2009 Outlook

Key items impacting outlook for 2009:

- Decline in average assets under management driven by equity market declines in 2008.
- Increase in Principal Financial Group FAS 87 and FAS 106 benefit expenses.
- More limited growth of capital intensive businesses and loss of earnings due to planned reduction of Investment Only.
- Continued weakness of Latin American currencies against the dollar.
- Positive impact of expense initiatives.

Net impact: (\$0.35) to (\$0.60) per share



2009 Outlook

The company expects 2009 operating earnings per diluted share (EPS) to range from \$2.75 to \$3.25.
